

Quarterly Update

September 2016

Highlights of Regular Town Board Meetings

June 21:

- The Fire Department's 50-year anniversary celebration will take place on Friday evening, July 1.
- Road repair work is continuing. Tower Road should be completed soon. Partridge and Sportman's Road will be pulverized.
- Many operators', cigarette, and beer licenses were approved.
- The U.S. Transportation Dept. will soon begin surveying along U.S. 8. Land owners along the highway may have to sign an easement.
- The goose problem at Lake Hilbert Park will be taken care of on Tuesday, June 28.
- The clerk reported there is approximately \$7,700 left over from the U.S.D.A. grant, which must be spend on equipment or repairs to the municipal building. Suggestion was made to buy a new refrigerator and new freezer for the kitchen.
- Discussion took place on lawns not being mowed on vacant homes/lots. Letters are being sent to the owners.
- The Historical Society reported they have recently been awarded two grants: one from Trans-Canada for \$500, and one from M&M Area Community Foundation for \$1,000. This grant must be used for repairs to the historical building by the end of this year. It will be used for staining the deck and installing gutters.

July 18:

- The town chairman announced that the Marinette Co. Economic Development Dept. is being revamped and will stress more education about the need in the county, especially in the northern part.
- The geese problem at Lake Hilbert has been eliminated.
- Paving on County "H" will be completed soon.
- It was noted that some children have been riding their bicycles thru the Veterans' Memorial. This is not acceptable. Chain link fencing will be put on the openings to deter this activity.
- The Historical Society has hired a contractor to install gutters on the historical building.

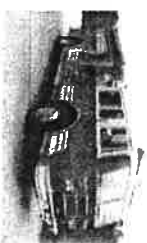
August 23:

- The board approved a motion to accept a contract with the DOT for payment of \$250 per parcel for easement property along U.S. Highway 8 as a sidewalk replacement payment.
- The garbage dumpsters at Lake Hilbert Park and the Goodman Fire Station are to be used for bagged garbage only. Do not put in recycling material, household appliances or furniture.
- The parking permit intake at Lake Hilbert this summer was \$2,000 over last year.
- The road foreman reported that chip sealing is done, the pulveriser will be here next week, and the crusher in 4-5 weeks.
- The town board had considered asking Marinette County permission for ATV use on County Highway H. However, due to the fact that ATV's are not obeying the speed limits, especially in the Lake Lafave and Lake Hilbert areas, this option will no longer be considered. ATV users must follow the posted speed limits and access areas in order to keep, or get any more, privileges.
- Gutters have been installed on the Goodman Historical building, and the new deck is in the process of being stained. The town of Goodman offered to supply two fire extinguishers for inside the building.

Note from the town board:

We are very proud of our new veterans' memorial, and would like to keep it in excellent condition. **Parents:** please instruct your children that this is not a playground, nor is it a round-about for bicycles. It is a place to honor and respect our veterans. Chains have been placed across the openings to prevent bicycle traffic. Anyone wishing to go inside to view the memorial can unhook the chains but remember to rehook them when you leave. Thank you so much. We appreciate your cooperation.
